Eligibility for Admission

1) Master's Degree Programme:

- a. Candidate shall possess a Bachelor's degree in the respective subject.
- b. Candidate shall have 6.00/10 or equivalent OGPA/equivalent percentage of marks for general category and 5.5/10 or equivalent OGPA/equivalent percentage of marks for SC/ST/Cat-I candidates at bachelor's degree level.
- c. Candidate shall be a citizen of India and must have studied in any educational institution in Karnataka State for a period of seven academic years at any time up to the Bachelor's degree as on 1st July of the admission year. [Not applicable to candidates who are GOK, GOI, ICAR nominees, NRIs and Foreign Nationals (FN)]. The domicile requirement is not applicable for admission to Doctoral degree programme.

The requirement of seven years study in any educational institution in Karnataka State for a period of seven academic years at any time up to the Bachelor's degree as on 1st July of the admission year is not required for those Children of defense personnel, Central Government employees/Statutory Corporation set up, owned or controlled by the Central / Karnataka State Government serving on duty in the State both on the date of submission of the application and during the period of at least 12 months immediately before such date, Children of State Government employees including children of Members of the All India services born on the Karnataka State Cadre.

2) Doctoral Degree Programme:

- a. The candidates should possess Master's Degree in respective subjects.
- b. Candidate should have OGPA of 6.50/10 or equivalent percentage of marks for general category and 6.00/10 or equivalent OGPA/equivalent percentage of marks for SC/ST/Cat-I/ candidates at Master's degree level.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE IN BRIEF

Students shall be admitted to the University in accordance with the Regulations issued by the Board of Management. Any modification to the Regulations shall be made by the Vice-Chancellor with the approval of the Board of Management in accordance with the rules of the Government that are in force and that may be issued from time to time by the Government in this regard. The number of students to be admitted will be decided by the Board of Management on the recommendations of the Academic Council.

A) Master's Programme

Selection for Masters degree programme will be done on the basis of the student's performance in bachelor degree programme and written test conducted by the University. The written test for admission will be of undergraduate level and will contain 100 objective type questions with four responses. Due weightage is also given to the students who have the medals won in academics, sports and cultural activities, passed in ICAR/JRF examinations and those students who are Physically handicapped / Anglo-Indians / Scouts & Guides / Children of Ex-Servicemen / Defense personnel. The final selection of candidates is done on the basis of performance of the candidates as per following scheme of evaluation:

Note:

- a. Candidates securing less than 50% of total marks as calculated above shall not be called for counseling, while SC/ST/Cat-I candidates securing less than 35% marks shall not be called for counseling.
- b. Candidates who have secured grades in 4 point scale shall submit a copy of the certificate of equivalent percentage, failing which, their applications shall be rejected.

B) Doctoral degree programme:

Selection for Doctoral degree programme will be done on the basis of the student's performance in Master degree programme and written test conducted by the University. The written test for admission will contain 100 objective type questions with four responses. Due weightage is also given to those students who have research publications, won medals in academics, sports and cultural activities, passed in ICAR/CSIR-SRF/ NET examinations and those students who are Physically handicapped / Anglo-Indians / Scouts & Guides / Children of Ex-Servicemen / Defence personnel. The final selection of candidates is done on the basis of performance of the candidates as per following scheme of evaluation:

- a. Candidates securing less than 50% of total marks as calculated above shall not be allotted seat. While SC/ST/Cat-I candidates securing less than 35% marks shall not be allotted seat.
- b. Candidates who have secured grades in 4 points scale should submit a copy of the certificate of equivalent percentage failing which their applications shall be rejected.
- c. Candidates whose Master's degree is not graded, the marks obtained by such candidates in written test will be calculated for 100 marks.
