“Technological Transformations in Agricultural Library and Information Systems and Services in the AI Era”

BACKGROUND:

The advances in digital technologies play a critical role in shaping the future of libraries. The digital revolutions in broadband, mobile devices, social networking and cloud computing have led to a fundamental transformation of physical libraries into the digital domain. The library and information services offered by libraries and information agencies have been greatly impacted and transformed by emerging technologies. "Libraries adapting to accommodate new applications of technology for learning, research, and information" is something that will happen very soon. It is necessary to think about implementing new technologies, upholding standards, and providing users with services that follow best practices. Recent developments in technology suggest that artificial intelligence can potentially be produced in machines. According to this perspective, intelligent systems are created to increase human potential. Libraries are compelled to embrace artificial intelligence (AI) in order to expand the range of services they offer, due to the significant advantages that come with its application. This International conference addresses the possible usefulness of AI in libraries after providing an outline of AI in the real world. ASSOCIATION OF AGRICULTURAL LIBRARIES AND DOCUMENTALISTS OF INDIA (AALDI)

The Association of Agricultural Librarians and Documentalists of India (AALDI) was founded in 1971 with an aim to bring Agricultural Librarians of the country on a platform to join hands to address matters of professional interests in improving library system and services towards the agricultural user community. The Association held its General Body meeting at Jawaharlal Nehru Krishi Vishwa Vidyalaya, Jabalapur in June 1973 and decided to publish a periodical entitled "AALDI Bulletin" annually to give vent to the intellectual thought of the Agricultural Library Professionals. The efforts of the Association bore fruits in 1974 when the first volume of the periodical saw the light of the day. To keep pace with the changing scenario and concept of agricultural librarianship, the title of the periodical was changed to "Indian Journal of Agricultural Library and Information Services" in 2008. It is important to note that the journal has been approved by the UGC vide UGC Journal Identification No. 64538. AALDI is a non-profit organization based in India that supports development in the entire field of Agricultural librarianship in India. The AALDI undertakes supports, coordinate, organizes general/special meetings and hold conferences every years on current problems of Libraries and Information services and other allied areas are selected as themes for discussions on these occasions. During the last International conference which was held at PAU, Ludhiana discussions were held to finalize the venue to hold the next international conference. Dr. U. S. Jadhav, Deputy Librarian, KVAFSU, Bidar submitted necessary proposal to host next International Conference in KVAFSU and it was approved by the General body meeting and necessary permission was accorded to the "Karnataka Veterinary, Animal and Fisheries Sciences University, Bidar" to host the 4th International Conference of AALDI in a befitting manner in the month of November 2024.

About the University

Karnataka Veterinary, Animal and Fisheries Sciences University (KVAFSU), Bidar was established exclusively for the development of education and learning; conduct of research and extension education and transfer the rural oriented technologies in the areas of Veterinary, Animal, Dairy and Fisheries Sciences in Karnataka as per the Karnataka Act No. 9 of 2004 and published in Karnataka Gazette on 23rd February, 2004.

The Library promotes intellectual growth and creativity by developing collections, facilitating access to information resources, teaching, research and extension. Library is considered to be the heart of an educational institution. Libraries play



a very important role in teaching, learning and research, and their main objective is to support the teaching, learning and research activities of the institution. The KVAFSU Library is engaged in developing; organizing, providing access among available resources to meet the information needs of students, scholars and faculty members of the university. In a nutshell the University Library and Information Centre has very rich collections print and non-print documents viz., of books, e-books (CABI, Elsevier, Wiley, Net base), e-journals, database such as J-Gate Agriculture and Biological Sciences (CeRA), Krishi Kosh, Indianjournal.com and many more. The University Library is hosting an International conference of Agricultural Librarians and users committee on the role of Agriculture Library in the networked Digital environment. The conference is scheduled to be held on November 2024 on 22nd and 23rd for the 1st time in Bidar and also in the history of KVAFSU.

About Bidar City

The name of Bidar appears to be derived from 'bidiru' which means bamboo. The place seems to have been known for bamboo clusters in the past. Bidar is a hill-top city situated on the deccan plateau, in the north-eastern part of Karnataka state with a distance of 700 km from Bengaluru (capital city of Karnataka state) and about 140 km from Hyderabad (capital city of the Telangana state). However, owing to its rich heritage, the city has a prominent place in the Archaeological Map of India. Bidar town is elevated above 600 MSL (mean sea level) with an annual rainfall of about 780 mm.

The city, Bidar is known for its 'Bidri handicraft' products, and its rich history. Bidar is also considered one of the holiest places for Sikh pilgrimage. Unlike other places in the region, Bidar is the coolest and wettest place in north Karnataka. Bidar is home for the second biggest Indian Air Force training centre in the country. Madrasa of Mahmud Gawan at Bidar, Karnataka has been a shining example of education and learning which was built in 1472. This institute was functional for two centuries and is now an important historical site.

Places of visit in and around Bidar :

Gurudwara Bidar is one of Holiest Place for Sikhs. Every year this place attracts lots of tourists from all parts of the country particularly during the months of November and March. Legend Saint Guru Nanak visited the place while the land was in the grip of a famine. The Guru performed a miracle at the request of the locals and a spring of water from the laterite rock mountain burst out. Till date, crystal clear water flows from the laterite trap and there is a belief that drinking of this water cures many ailments.

As per the local traditional saying, the Shiva Linga idol in this temple is one of those installed by Shri RAM during the time of his journey back from Lanka. The location of the temple in a valley is mesmerizing to the eyes. Every year at the time of Shivrathri festival, lot of tourists visit this place. A natural spring flows into a pond in front of the temple which is called 'Papnasha'

The powerful deity as per the belief here is situated in the cave of nearly 300 meters. One has to wade through water up to chest height to have darshan of the deity. The image of Lord Narasimha is found on a laterite wall at the end of the tunnel. Devotees carry small children on their shoulders. Though the water in the cave is muddy owing to constant wading through it by the crowd, it is meant to have sulphur with healing properties, which treats skin issues.

Bidar Fort is considered as one of the most formidable forts of India. The fort was distinctly planned and built on the brink of the Deccan plateau by Sultan Ahmed Wali between AD 1426 to AD 1432. It is surrounded by 5.5 kms of defense wall consisting of 37 massive polygonal bastions and 7 strong irregular rhombic shaped gates. This fort is unique due to its triple moat defence which was made by Turkish mercenaries in resemblance to Medieval European forts. The monuments namely Takht Mahal, Tarkash Mahal, Rangeen Mahal, Gagan Mahal, Solah Khamba Mosque and Naubat Khana are noteworthy in the fort. It has collection of swords, guns, canon, canon balls used during Bahamani sultanate period and Barid Shahi well preserved by Archeological survey of India (ASI).

Basavakalyana is famous for the world's tallest Basavanna statue, which stands 108 feet high. Before India's independence, Basavakalyan was called Kalyani. After independence and division of states on linguistic basis in 1956, Kalyana was renamed as Basavakalyan in memory of Vishwaguru Basavanna, who was a great revolutionary who established spiritual democracy called "Anubhava Mantapa" (which is also called as the "First Parliament of the World" led by Saint Allamprabhu) in the 12th century in India.

Weather: During November, the weather is mostly expected to be pleasant. The temperature may range from 16°C (Min) to 24°C (Max).

Clothing: Regular clothing with light woollens or other warm clothing for the evenings, especially outdoors, is recommended.

Connectivity : By Air - The nearest airport to Bidar is Rajiv Gandhi International Airport (Hyderabad) about 140 km by road.

By Train : Bidar is well connected by rail from Hyderabad, Bangalore and Mumbai. Visitors/ Participants can also take the train to Gulbarga city and from there take a bus to Bidar, which is about two and half hours journey.

By Road : There are regular Government (KSRTC) and private buses which ply from Bangalore via Hyderabad NH 7 and NH 9; the journey takes nearly 13 hours. Hyderabad is about 120 km from Bidar and Zahirabad, Telangana is about 31 km.
